Year 2 Spring Term Curriculum		How you can support learning at home
Reading	Read Write Inc Our story time books will be: The magic paintbrush, Dogger, Anna Hibiscus song, Stuck, George's marvellous Medicine and Fantastic Mr Fox.	Read 'shared reading' books at least 2x per week and phonics (RWI) for 5-10 mins daily. Children can change their shared reading book on Monday and Thursday. Please sign your children reading records if you have read with them at home.
Writing	Traditional tale — Jack and the beanstalk George's marvellous medicine instruction writing Fantastic Mr Fox — chapter retell Poetry Foxes — Non Chronological report	Practise spellings ready for the weekly spelling test on a Friday. Play on spelling shed 3 x a week. Practise year I and 2 common exception words spellings. Ensure children use Fred fingers and apply phonics when writing at home. Encourage children to follow kinetic letters letter formation to ensure neat handwriting. They should sit their letters on the line and snuggle the letters together. Encourage children to remember sentence rules when writing e.g. capital letters and full stops.
Maths	Money Multiplication and division Length and Height Mass, capacity and Temperature	Play on times table rockstars or numbols 3 x a week. Practise counting in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s. Identify 2D and 3D shapes around the house and describe their properties Practise mental addition and subtraction of single and then two digit numbers.
Geography	Journeys – Food Where does our food come from?	
Science	Materials Animals Including Humans	Talk about why objects we sue at home are made from particular materials. Why are those materials suitable? Research animals and their offspring. Discuss the importance of a balanced diet, exercise and hygiene.
Arł	Andy Goldsworthy — Natural Sculptures	Collect natural objects to make your own natural sculptures if you wish.
Design & Technology		Discuss different types of structure/building. What structures can you build e.g. with Lego. Take a photo and add to your Class DoJo portfolio.
R.E.	Holy Books Why does Easter matter to Christians	Talk about books that are special to you. Talk about the easter story and why Christians celebrate easter.
