Talk Through Stories

'Talk Through Stories' is used alongside the RWI programme to develop children's language and vocabulary. Teachers share a well-loved story with the children over one week. These stories are language

rich. Teachers support children to understand these words and use them in their communication and play.

In FP, this includes activities linked to book of the week, for example, parallel play and TUFF tray activities along with a 'sign of the week'.
